

Wash- and Careguide - Horses

PHOTOSENSITIVITY REACTIONS, SUMMER ECZEMA:

- Wash the intended area daily, use the solution at a ratio of 1:10 with a disposable foam cloth.
- Let the area dry by air
- Use KovaLine Wipes around the eyes and ears
- Let the area dry by air
- Do not rinse after application

WOUNDS AND ABRASIONS:

- Wash the intended area with disposable foam cloths in a mixed solution of 1:10
- Wash until a light foam/lather is formed
- Do not rinse after application
- Wash the area daily until the wound has healed

DERMATOFILOSE CONGOLENSIS RAIN ECZEMA:

- Wash the intended infected area daily, a light foam/lather should be formed
- Let the area dry by air
- Use the solution at a ratio of 1:10 with a disposable foam cloth
- Do not rinse after application

AROUND THE EYES AND EARS (WOUNDS, PHOTSENSITIVITY REACTIONS, SUMMER ECZEMA)

- Wash the intended area daily
- Keep the solution away from direct contact with the surface of the eye
- Use the solution on the outer of the ear, use the corner edge of a wipe or a disposable foam cloth with your index finger for better control

TAIL AND MANE:

DAY ONE:

- Lightly wet the horse
- Wash the horse with the 1:10 care solution
- If the solution does not foam/lather repeat the procedure
- Do not rinse after application

DAY TWO:

- Lightly wet the horse
- Wash the intended infected area with the 1:10 solution, have a bowl with the solution on hand
- Do not rinse after application
- The procedure is continued daily as needed until the issue is resolved

MUD FEVER:

- Clean the infected area and around the mudfever with a brush and make sure the area is dry.
- Apply KovaLine OW Oil/Wax ointment on a clean and dry surface
- The procedure is continued daily until the issue is resolved. It is important to continue the treatment until the area is well and healed. In doubt contact your local veterinarian. No conflict with the FEI Prohibited Substances List

SUPPORT/AID TREATMENT:

KovaLine is a non-medical product who belongs in the category of support/aid treatment. This means that support for controlled treatment with drugs, adjusting the environment or Vaccination.

SUPPORT/AID TREATMENT INVOLVES:

- Optimal nutrition (Omega-3 and Omega-6)
- Wash and control of microorganisms on the skin
- Cleaning the ear
- Hoof and leg care
- Antibiotics (when necessary)
- Fungicide (when necessary)

It is important to identify the primary cause of the disorder in any horse.

A very important factor that needs to be focused on is optimal nutrition, the intake of high-quality Omega-3, Omega-6 and fatty acids play crucial role in maintaining a healthy skin in horses.
